Perfect by Natasha Friend-Following the death of her father, thirteen-year-old, Isabelle Lee uses bulimia as a way to avoid the grief that she is going through over her terrible loss.

Hawksong by Amelia Atwater-Rhodes-In a world that has been at war so long that nobody remembers the reason for the fighting, Danica and Zane who are shapeshifters agree to marry in the hope of bringing peace to their troubled land even though they are afraid and do not trust each other.

Perfect Shot by Elaine Alphin-Brian uses basketball to block out his bad memories about his girlfriend and her family who were gunned down a year ago, but the upcoming murder trial and a high school history assignment force him to face his past and decide how far he should see justice served.
